



Introduction of the Memoirs of The Hong Kong Natural History Society No.23:

This publication reports the botanical results of the Biodiversity Survey of Hong Kong, which was funded by a grant from the Environment and Conservation Fund to David Dudgeon and Richard Corlett of the Department of Ecology & Biodiversity at the University of Hong Kong. The botanical part of the survey was carried out in collaboration with the Kadoorie Farm & Botanic Garden, the South China Institute of Botany, and the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department of the Hong Kong Government. The aims of the Biodiversity Survey were to identify sites and species of conservation importance. The 2135 vascular plant species which have been reliably recorded from Hong Kong are listed, with information on widely-used synonyms, growth form, habitats, current status and, for rare species, current localities.
