

The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) is an inter-governmental agreement that seeks to ensure international trade does not threaten the survival of wild plants and animals. Species listed in its three appendices are given differing degrees of protection. Appendix I includes highly threatened species for which all forms of commercial trade is prohibited, whereas Appendix II includes vulnerable species for which trade is closely regulated; those listed in Appendix III are protected from trade in just one or a few countries. The Convention is administered by CITES authorities in each country (or jurisdiction), which oversee the licencing of restricted specimens for export or import.
